## 2007 Annual Report

### **Mission:**

Meals-on-Wheels of Johnson and Ellis Counties **serves** the children of yesterday by helping needy homebound elderly and disabled persons remain independent and healthy in their homes by providing home-delivered meals, daily personal contact, and support for individuals and their families.

### **Highlights:**

- Meals-on-Wheels of Johnson & Ellis Counties (Meals-on-Wheels) is a community-based aging services organization. Meals-on-Wheels provides Home-Delivered Meals and Case Management to frail, isolated, elderly and disabled persons. Also provided is Caregiver Services and Information and Assistance to families with needy elderly and disabled family members. Meals-on-Wheels works closely with home health agencies, doctors' offices, hospital discharge planners, and other community service groups to coordinate services to those in need. Meals-on-Wheels celebrated 30 years of service this year, serving Johnson County since 1977, and Ellis County since 2001.
- All Meals-on-Wheels services are provided throughout both counties, with services extending into adjoining counties. Emphasis is placed on individuals versus numbers, communities as opposed to governmental boundaries, and timely services for needy individuals over lengthy waiting lists.
- A twelve member Board of Trustees, with Trustees residing throughout Johnson and Ellis County, governs the organization. The FY2007 Board of Trustees were:

- Two Advisory Councils work with the Board and staff to guide Meals-on-Wheels services, to plan for the future of the organization, and to raise community awareness and resources to support the work of Meals-on-Wheels.
- The staff of Meals-on-Wheels includes twenty-two full and part-time persons, with over 600 volunteers assisting with the delivery of services. The executive director has been with Meals-on-Wheels since 1988. Senior staff includes: Amy Jackson, Director of Development, Tracy Moore, Director of Client Services, and Angela Farley, Director of Administration.
- The Johnson County administrative offices relocated in July to 106 E. Kilpatrick, Cleburne, Texas. The Johnson County Commissioners' Court makes these facilities possible at no cost to the organization. The Ellis County office is located at 503 Ferris Avenue, Suite D, Waxahachie, Texas.
- Meals-on-Wheels is a nationally certified nutrition program through the Meals On Wheels Association of America (MOWAA). This accreditation acknowledges programs that demonstrate the highest standards of services to its communities.
- Local Independent Charities (LIC) recognizes Meals-on-Wheels of Johnson and Ellis Counties as a "Best in America" organization. The "Best In America" seal was inspired by a recent comparative review of "watchdog" groups by the National Council of Nonprofit Associations. Of these groups, LIC was acknowledged as one of the most rigorous in its application of member eligibility, in conjunction with their own additional testing standards. A LIC member since 2000, Meals-on-Wheels has met those standards and tests.
- Meals-on-Wheels is funded by local donations from individuals, civic groups, and businesses; client and participant contributions; the United Ways of Johnson County, West Ellis County, and Greater Ennis; Commissioners' Courts of Johnson and Ellis County; Combined Federal Campaign; State Employees Charitable Campaign; private foundations; and shrinking federal and state grants. Meals-on-Wheels contracts with the North Central Texas Area Agency on Aging and the Texas Department of Aging and Disability services to provide specific aging services in Ellis and Johnson County.
- Revenues for the fiscal year 2007 were **\$1,515,372** with expenses being **\$1,476,161**. Approximately 56% of the expenses were spent in Johnson County, with 44% spent in Ellis County.
- This past year has proven to be another challenging year in the tremendous growth we have seen in services - a 35% overall increase over last year. In order to meet these challenges, Meals-on-Wheels has continued its aggressive fundraising activities this past year, locally raising over **\$806,176** in discretionary funds, while attracting over 400 new donors.
- During this year, over 2,600 needy elderly and disabled persons received direct services from Meals-on-Wheels, which included:

**Services:**

Meals-on-Wheels of Johnson and Ellis Counties is making a positive difference in the lives of many by providing services that help elderly and disabled individuals maintain their independence and stay in their own homes, where they want to be.

**Home-Delivered Meals (better known as Meals-on-Wheels)**

Good nutrition is the key to good health, especially for someone who is homebound. Our meals provide 1/3 of the recommended daily amount of nutrition. Caring volunteers deliver over 650 meals, Monday through Friday, to those in need. Frozen weekend meals are delivered on Fridays. Volunteers give clients a break from the isolation of a very lonely existence. Many times the daily visit from the volunteer is their only contact with the outside world. A meal and a smile can make all the difference!

**Nutritional Supplements:**

Meals-on-Wheels offers nutritional supplements at cost to those that need additional nourishment in their diets. Maybe a person is not getting all of the nutrients needed everyday by eating well-balanced meals, or maybe he or she is just skipping some meals altogether. A liquid nutritional supplement can provide help to those in need.

**Caregiver Education**

Meals-on-Wheels wants to assure that Caregivers have the most up-to-date information, education, and resources to assist them in caring for a loved one. We realize the challenges in caring for an elderly or disabled parent or family member. Meals-on-Wheels has useful information on dealing with aging, mental challenges such as Alzheimer's and dementia, housing options, legal issues, in-home services, end-of-life issues, palliative care and more.

**Information & Assistance**

Finding your way through the maze of services and options available for elderly and disabled loved ones can be very frustrating. Meals-on-Wheels maintains telephone numbers and information for services such as Social Security, housing, public benefits, legal matters, etc. We also have information available on Meals-on-Wheels providers across the nation through our membership in the Meals-On-Wheels Association of America.

**Special Services**

Special Services include a wide array of "special" services for "special" needs. Liquid nutritional supplements are provided "at-cost" to persons who are nutritionally "at risk." Special food sacks are also available to those in need. Meals-on-Wheels also assists in arranging for minor home repairs and modifications as well as dental, hearing, and eyeglass needs. Other special services are provided as needs arise.

**Events & Activities:****Community "VIP" Events/Volunteer Forums**

This year with the increased need for fundraising efforts, Meals-on-Wheels continued hosting community "VIP" events in each of the communities we serve throughout Johnson and Ellis Counties. The events are intended to raise community awareness, recruit new individuals, and better inform current volunteers, clients and donors. Each event is one hour, and unique to each community.

**Mayors for Meals**

As part of the national March for Meals awareness campaign of the Meals on Wheels Association of America, 21 mayors from both Ellis and Johnson County delivered meals on March 21<sup>st</sup>. Their efforts helped raise awareness of Meals-on-Wheels throughout the area.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Benefit BBQ**

Meals-on-Wheels held its Annual Benefit BBQ on March 31<sup>st</sup> at Loma Linda Events Pavilion in Palmer. With over 200 people in attendance, friends and supporters of Meals-on-Wheels helped raise \$18,000 to help serve those in need in Ellis County.

### 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Golf Benefit

Meals-on-Wheels 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Golf Benefit held on September 13<sup>th</sup> was the most successful Benefit to date! With a full field morning and afternoon, golfers and volunteers enjoyed a fun-filled day of food and fun! Along with sponsors, 268 golfers, and over 50 volunteers, the event raised over \$70,000 to feed the homebound elderly and disabled persons in our community. This is the largest amount ever raised for the Golf Benefit since its beginning in 1988. This year's event was played at the Hidden creek Golf Club in Burleson.

### National Philanthropy Day

National Philanthropy Day is the special day set aside each year to recognize and pay tribute to the great contributions that philanthropy -- and those people active in the philanthropic community -- have made to our lives, our communities and our world. Meals-on-Wheels celebrated the 2006 Annual National Philanthropy Day by honoring Walgreen's Distribution at a luncheon held at the Fort Worth Renaissance Worthington Hotel. The annual event was sponsored by the Association of Fundraising Professionals.

Over 500 people gathered to honor non-profit organizations, private foundations, corporations, clubs and individual donors from all over North Texas.
